Microlending

Since launching the microlending program in 2009, WEDI has loaned nearly \$1.4 million to 113 business owners.



Economic Development

Since 2012, clients have created or retained more than **180 full-time jobs**, all of which are filled by residents of WNY.

Between **2017-20**, 35 Economic Development clients generated **gross revenues of \$15+ million**.

Over the course of the pandemic, WEDI deployed more than \$1.2M in funding to help businesses recover from the pandemic. A majority of these businesses were Minority and Women Owned Businesses (MWBEs). WEDI is on track to deploy an additional \$1M by the end of 2022.
